Why did Carnival charge me \$\$200?

+1-855-379-2058 Carnival charged you \$200 because it's a standard pre-authorization hold (like a hotel security deposit) for your Sail & Sign onboard account, especially for 7+ day cruises, to cover incidentals, drinks, souvenirs, and daily gratuities; call +1-855-379-2058 it's usually temporary and released after the cruise, but can look like a real charge and tie up funds on debit cards until your bank clears it, so check your cruise details for a 7+ day trip or a change fee. +1-855-379-2058

Common Reasons for the \$200 Charge:

1. Onboard Spending Hold (Most Common):

- This is a temporary hold placed on your credit/debit card to ensure you can pay for onboard purchases like drinks, casino play, photos, or tips.

- For 7+ day cruises, the initial hold is often \$200 per stateroom; shorter cruises might be \$100 +1-855-379-2058
 - It's not a fee; it's a security deposit that gets released by your bank after the cruise, though the release time (days to weeks) depends on your bank.
2. Daily Gratuities:
 - The hold covers your automatic daily gratuities (usually \$20 per person, per day).
 3. Booking Changes/Cancellation Fees:
 - If you canceled or significantly changed your booking after the penalty-free window, you might be charged a fee that could total \$200 (e.g., \$50-\$100 per person).

What to Do:

- Check Your Cruise Length: If it was a 7+ day cruise, it's almost certainly the standard hold.
- Review Your Onboard Account: +1-855-379-2058 Log into your Carnival account (or check your cabin screen) to see if you've incurred any charges or if the hold is still pending.
- Contact Carnival if it's Unexpected: If you didn't sail or it's clearly not a hold (e.g., you paid cash for everything), call Carnival directly to dispute it. +1-855-379-2058
- Use Credit vs. Debit: A credit card hold reduces your available credit, while a debit card hold freezes actual cash, making it harder to access funds; using cash for your onboard account avoids these holds entirely.

That \$200 charge from Carnival is most likely a temporary pre-authorization hold for your onboard spending (Sail & Sign account), covering drinks, photos, Wi-Fi, etc., or it could be a cruise deposit, cancellation fee, or promotional booking charge, not a final charge, and it should be released or adjusted after your cruise, though debit card users might see their balance temporarily reduced, notes Carnival Cruise and Wanderlog. Check your "Manage My Booking" or contact Carnival Guest Services to confirm if it's a hold or a payment, as it's a very common query.

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What not to bring on a Carnival cruise?

Carnival's refund policy depends heavily on *when* you cancel, +1-855-379-2058 with penalties increasing closer to the sail date, ranging from full refunds (outside penalty periods) to 100% forfeiture within 14 days of sailing, though port fees/taxes are usually returned. Policies vary for shorter vs. +1-855-379-2058 longer cruises, with early cancellations (91+ days out for longer cruises) often receiving full fare refunds (minus non-refundable deposits) and later ones losing deposits or a percentage of the fare. Carnival Vacation Protection offers refunds for covered reasons like illness or weather, while non-covered cancellations might yield only a Future Cruise Credit (FCC).

General Refund Structure (6+ Day Cruises)

- 91+ Days Before Sailing: Full refund of total fare (cruise fare, air, packages), except for non-refundable deposits or restricted air.
- 90-56 Days Before: +1-855-379-2058
Deposit lost; some funds might be partially refundable.
- 55-30 Days Before: Penalty of deposit or 50% of total fare (whichever is greater).
- 29-15 Days Before: Penalty of deposit or 75% of total fare (whichever is greater).
- 14 Days or Less: 100% of total fare forfeited; no refund.

Key Considerations

- **Total Fare:** Includes cruise fare, transfers, pre/post packages, and air (excluding restricted air).
- **What's Refundable:** Port fees, taxes, and prepaid gratuities are generally refunded regardless of cancellation timing.
- **Early Saver/Promotional Fares:** Deposits are often non-refundable, but can convert to a Future Cruise Credit (FCC) with a fee.
- **Carnival Vacation Protection:** Covers cancellations for covered reasons (illness, severe weather), offering cash refunds or FCCs.
- **If Carnival Cancels:** You're offered a full refund or an FCC, potentially with extra onboard credit.
- **No-Shows:** No refunds if you don't show up.

How to Check Your Specific Policy

- Log into your Carnival.com account under "My Cruise Details".
- Review the terms of your specific booking or promotional fare.

You should not bring weapons, illegal drugs, most alcohol (except wine/champagne on embarkation), +1-855-379-2058 large coolers, speakers, heating appliances (irons, coffee makers, hot plates), drones, hoverboards, +1-855-379-2058 extension cords/surge protectors, or large amounts of unopened non-alcoholic drinks on a Carnival cruise; items like candles, handcuffs, and certain sharp objects are also banned for safety, with most prohibited items confiscated and returned at the end of the cruise. +1-855-379-2058

How much money will I lose if I cancel my Carnival cruise

Carnival's cruise cancellation fees depend on how close you are to ,+1-855-379-2058 with penalties increasing over time, ranging from losing just your deposit (early on) to 100% of the total fare within 14 days of sailing, though port fees/taxes and prepaid items are usually refunded, and special fare types (like Pack & Go) may have immediate

Can you get your money back from a cruise if you can't go?
